Summertime Fun Basket Julie Kleinrath

Woven on an oval wood base, this basket is just fun. Quick to weave, it features a band of triple twining in seagrass and finished with flat braided leather handles. The leather flip flop is added after the basket is finished. Finish with as many beachy glass beads and stones as you would like. Kit includes 50 beads.

This delightful glass vase holds flowers, pencils, or your favorite basket weaving tools. The vase starts with tapered staves that will be inserted into a pre-finished cherry base. While weaving with fine cane, a reverse twill is introduced, providing a broken arrow accent in the center of the vase. The vase is completed with a one-piece pre-finished cherry rim. Tools are provided.

Counter Caddy- Swirl Sandy Whalen

The swirl design is developed by using groups of different colored willows some bark, some peeled. The rim is woven with a track border which resembles a braid border - the easy way.

Black Walnut Special Venie Hinson

Take your curling skills up a level. Weave this basket with a challenging special twist: horizontal curls woven into ONE HORIZONTAL ROW AT A TIME. The curls twist in 3 directions between each set of spokes, creating a lacy blossom look. Begin with a solid black walnut base and natural and black walnut overlay spokes. Then chase weave on the side. Curls are woven in as the sides are woven.
